A look back on our summer

We aim to give our campers the opportunity to develop their skills in a variety of areas. We strive to ensure that every single one of our programs are engaging, age-appropriate, inclusive, and fun!

We welcomed 782 campers to 14 different camp programs. This year, the majority of campers were between the ages of 12-15 years old, joining us from each Atlantic province. As in previous years, more than half of our campers heard about Brigadoon Village through the IWK Health Centre.

We were thrilled to offer a new camp this summer for children and youth who are deaf or hard of hearing, Camp Whatcha-Say. Thirty-three campers came from across Atlantic Canada, for the first camp of its kind in our community.

With 100% of campers and their families telling us they would recommend Brigadoon to another family, we are confident that our summer camp programs are hitting their mark!







Space to breathe

As Brigadoon Village enters its tenth year, we are always finding new ways to expand and improve our camp program to give our campers the best experience possible. This past summer, we created a new program space named Wonderland. It quickly became a camper favourite!

Wonderland is a camper-directed play area, tucked away in the trees, away from the hustle and bustle of camp. It's where campers could spend their free-time, either creating art, reading a book, or hanging out in the hammocks for some quiet time.

Wonderland has a collection of arts and craft supplies, musical instruments, science experiments, and basic tools so that campers can choose what they would like to do. The play is completely unstructured, with staff empowering the campers to make their own decisions and do what they'd like to, without any further facilitation from counsellors.




